*For example: CO 2.3 (History) and CO 4.4 (Political Science) both require analysis and application, directly supporting the development of PO2.*

- **5.2 Emphasis on Skills:** The inclusion of action verbs like "Analyze," "Evaluate," and "Create" (Synthesis) ensures that the focus is on **demonstrable skills** rather than rote memorization, thereby enhancing employability (PO7).
- **5.3 Ethical and Social Focus:** COs 2.4, 3.3, 4.4, and 4.5 specifically link the academic content to broader **social and ethical issues**, guaranteeing the fulfillment of PO5 (Social Responsibility) and PO6 (Ethical Reasoning).

## 6. Future Scope and Continuous Improvement

- **6.1 Internal Review:** The respective departments will use these COs as the basis for course delivery and assessment. Results will be analyzed annually to determine the percentage of students achieving each CO.
